Account of the Gospel Labours of John Churchman

On my return from Philadelphia [1767] I sat with friends at their week day meeting in Wilmington, which through the continued goodness of the Lord, was in some measure a profitable season, I hope to many: Here I felt a strong desire to see the friends together, who are owners of the grist-mills lately built at and near Brandiwyne, and upon notice thereof, they met the same afternoon at the house of Daniel Byrnes, when I had an opportunity to discharge my mind in an affectionate manner, of what had impressed it towards them, which they appeared to receive in a degree of the same love, and as I believe it came from the author of all good, who is alone worthy of praise, a blessing may attend that opportunity if rightly remembered.
